**2010 Women of Distinction Awards  
CALL FOR CANDIDATES**

Montreal, December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2009 – Who will receive a prestigious Women of Distinction Award in 2010? The YWCA Montreal launches its call for candidates for the 17<sup>th</sup> edition of the Women of Distinction Awards which will also celebrating the 135<sup>th</sup> anniversary of its creation.

In 1994, the YWCA Montreal joined with the national YWCA movement to present the first Women of Distinction Awards to honour the achievements of exceptional women. Since then, more than 175 women have received a Women of Distinction Award from the YWCA Montreal including Ms. Chantal Petitclerc, Ms. Rane Lee, Ms. Wanda Kaluzny and Ms. Karen Radford.

The Women of Distinction Awards are given to women who are represented in various activity sectors: Arts and Culture, Business and Professions, Communications, Community Service, Education, Entrepreneurship, Science and Health, and Sports and Wellness. An award is also given to a Young Woman of Distinction and the Advancement of Women and Pioneer awards are given to women who have made an extraordinary contribution to the advancement of women. The Women of Distinction selection criteria are influence, impact, achievement and actions.

The presentation of the 2010 Women of Distinction Awards allows the Women's Y Foundation to publicly recognize the contribution of exceptional women and to raise some \$250,000 for the YWCA Montreal programs.

The nomination period ends on Monday, March 8, 2010. Laureates will be honoured at an awards ceremony on Monday, October 4, 2010.
